## OUR NEW BUILDING



In April 2021, B'More Clubhouse moved to 831 North Calvert Street. This historic firehouse is located in the Mount Vernon neighborhood,

where we have been located since our founding in 2009.

The building provides room for the Clubhouse to grow over the years to come. There are approximately 5,500 sq. feet between the two floors, which will allow us to double the number of members we are able to serve on a daily basis. There is a full commercial kitchen (with a pizza oven to boot!), and plenty of space for our Career Development, Membership, and Communications programs.

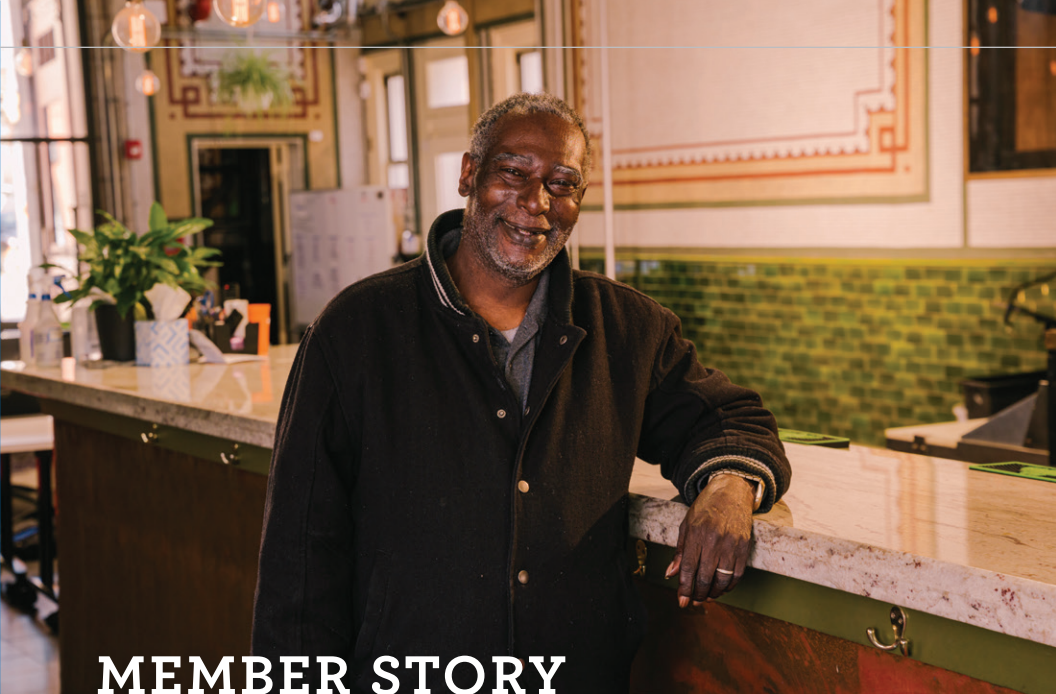
We offer tours on a daily basis and cannot wait to show you our new space!

I am very grateful for the opportunity to do things that I thought I wouldn't be able to do at one point in my life."

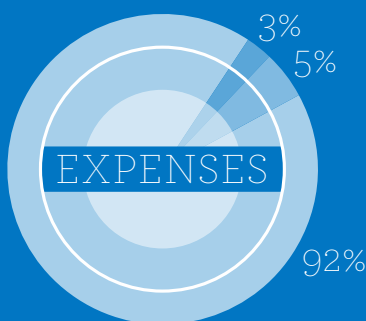

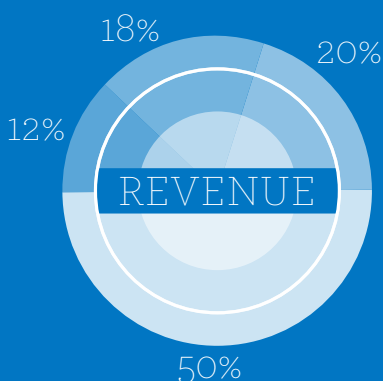
## 2021 EXPENSES
